PUBLICITY REPORT – MAY

1. GSA Annual Celebrity Golf Event

Proposal of the idea, that as each team takes a place in the Golf competition we can advertise the fact on our club facebook page. It also gives us the chance to keep advertising the golf day to our members and visitors to the site.

2. Sponsorship Boards

Suggestion that we continue the sponsorship boards surrounding the pool, reducing the costing to say \$500 per board rather than the \$1500 that was charged in previous years. With numbers of around 1000 adults going through the pool gates per week this offers a great cost effective marketing solution to small business. I think we could also tie the sponsorship boards in with a banner advert on the website and a page about each particular business that takes on a board. I have a couple of businesses that are ready to take sponsorship as soon as the school gives approval.

3. Website

I am in the process of revamping the website. The initial aim of the revamp is to make the website our number one marketing tool to attract new members to the club. As the development of the website progresses I intend to allocate access for various committee members so that they can add content to the website in the form of news related to their particular role. I also intend to add profiles of various swimmers in the club, video interviews, surveys of club members etc etc... but it all takes time... lots and lots of time....

4. Marketing flyers

I have discussed with Diamond Swim the development of some double sided DL flyers that can be placed in the swimming pool flyer rack advertising our swim club. They have a massive database of younger swimmers that know nothing about our swim club and would probably be interested in joining or at least finding out more. Brian Stehr has suggested certificates inviting children to participate in club-night once they graduate to advanced learn to swim.

5. Value Adding to Membership

I am currently in discussions with Ironman regarding sponsorship of the club in the form of a value add to the membership pack. We will have further details on this for the next committee meeting.




RACE SECRETARY REPORT – MAY
